Welcome and opening Alia Karaman, Chair, Centennial Park and Moore Park CTB	 The meeting was opened by the Chair and an Acknowledgement of Country was given. The Chair noted that the First Nations representative (Barbara Simms) has not provided a formal resignation. GSP will progress appointing a suitable representative once this has been received, subject to ministerial approval. 	1. Update on Moore Park Golf Michael Rose, GSP Trust Board Chair	 GSP provided an overview of the Premier's recent announcement about Moore Park Golf Course. GSP noted the commitment to engage with the CTB in accordance with the GSP Consultation and Engagement Framework. The CTB will have an opportunity to participate in the public engagement process. GSP and the CTB discussed: Noted that GSPT Board should be consulted on government decisions. suggestion to establish off park business hubs as per the GSPT Act 2022where funds are generated off park and made available for the parklands to address any revenue shortfall from the proposal. the process and timeframe for receiving CTB input on the proposal. Noted that consultation with the CTB should be considered and the CTB would like to contribute meaningfully to the process. suggestion for the new parkland to include facilities for teenagers. the government's commitment to the proposal. Update on Moore Park East Trish Ferreira, Senior Manager Program Management, GSP	 The CTB unanimously carried a motion about the car parking¹ and agreed to amend the motion to be submitted by the CTB rather than the GSP Chief Executive. GSP and the CTB discussed: the light rail was built to bring people to the sporting stadium and reduce the need for car parking. progress on the sports field upgrade. GSP took on notice a question about whether this field has a fence. whether dogs are allowed on the sports field. whether the driveway will be shortened. GSP took on notice a question about when the driveway was installed. the timeline for removal of car parking on Lower Kippax and Showground Field. why the Venues NSW car park has been delayed and disappointment at limited consultation about the decision. whether the funding associated with the Moore Park East Lower Kippax landscape works will be repurposed for Kippax Lake. whether the whole of Kippax Lake is part of the upgrades. Suggestion to consider fencing around the pond. 	2.	GSP to provide response to question about when the driveway was installed. CTB to contact NSW Government about car parking decision as per motion below.
Centennial Park Homestead presentation Ben Tax, Director Property Services, GSP	 GSP provided an update about the Centennial Park Homestead rejuvenation works which will be undertaken by the tenant, including an indicative works program. GSP noted that the works were discussed with the former Centennial Parklands Community Consultative Committee. The CTB raised queries about whether the footprint will increase, whether the changes will be visible from the park, what the additional space will be used for and whether current operations will continue. The CTB noted that in future the community and CTB should be more widely informed on tenant led projects. The CTB asked whether there are any other tenant-led proposals in Centennial Park of which to be aware. 	1.	Provide link to Centennial Park Homestead Development Application

¹ That the CTB, representing the voice of residents surrounding Centennial and Moore Park, strongly opposes any proposed plans by the NSW Government to delay the removal of parking in the Moore Park East precinct. Further, the CTB supports increased promotion and use of public and active transport options in order to access facilities in Centennial and Moore parks and surrounding precinct. Further, the CTB will convey to the Premier; the Minister for Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Heritage; the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces; the Minister for Transport; and the Members for Sydney, Vaucluse, Coogee, and Heffron, our strong opposition to any proposed plans for a delay in returning the parklands to the community and proposed plans to increase traffic congestion in the precinct, drawing attention to our reasons for our objections.
